The Illinois State USBC Association will be honoring a current/past ILUSBC Youth Bowler for outstanding performance in the sport of Youth Bowling including local, state and national levels into the Illinois Youth Hall of Legends for their achievements and skills during their youth career, provided they meet the following eligibility requirements:

1. Candidates must be amateur as defined by USBC. Only those who have not bowled for money or merchandise prizes in accordance with USBC eligibility rule 400 are eligible.
2. Inducting a maximum of 2 males and 2 females.
3. Must have a minimum 8 years of bowling in certified leagues in Illinois during their youth career.
4. Must have maintained an average of 190 or higher for males and 170 and higher for females for 3 years.
5. There is no age requirement of the applicant.
6. Judging is based 100% on Bowling Achievement/Skills during their youth career.
